

Urgent Message: Johnson & Johnson Vaccine Information

April 16, 2021

For Alameda County Homeless Providers and People Experiencing Homelessness

The Food and Drug Administration and Center for Disease Control are investigating reports of an extremely rare disorder involving people with blood clots in combination with low platelets in a very small number of individuals who have received the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine.

Alameda County Health Care for the Homeless provided Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccines to your shelter site within the past three weeks.

If you or your clients received the Johnson & Johnson vaccine in the past three weeks **AND** are **newly** experiencing any of the following symptoms, please be aware this could be serious -- seek medical care or call 911 immediately:

- Severe headache
- Backache
- Abdominal pain
- Shortness of breath
- Leg swelling
- New or easy bruising
- Blurred vision
- Fainting or loss of consciousness
- Loss of control over movement in part of the body
- Seizures
- Coma
