E. HCH DIRECTOR'S REPORT	Lucy Kasdin, ACHCH Program Director presented the Director's Report (attached). Highlights that were discussed:  1.Review of Q3 Calendar Year Health Center Dashboard  Growth in patients and services across the health center, except for the roll out of AHS Mobile Health and Street Health Contracts. Discussion of Street Health and AHS Mobile Health sites and hours.  Issues of abatement actions at Grove Way Castro Valley.  ACHCH is currently operating 4 Street Health teams, and is planning to expand to 7 teams within the next few months, and hoping to get to 10 in 2020, with specific geographic focus. Learning Community activities and trainings growing. There has been some slowness by contractors in ramping	

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	<ul> <li>up services, and Commissioners expressed some concern in face of the need.</li> <li>Personnel</li> <li>Sr. Pharmacist Seth Gomez PharmD begins on 11/4. In the next six weeks, the Sr. Pharmacist will start and be providing direct services at TRUST and StreetHealth and technical assistance for street health contractors. Our goal is to provide support to other street health teams to increase comfort and success regarding prescribing in the field.</li> <li>Behavioral Health Clinical Supervisor – Shelter Health: ACHCH is currently working to fill this vacancy to manage ACHCH Shelter Health activities.</li> </ul>	
	HRSA PCHP Expansion: ACHCH is pursuing expansion funding available by HRSA to expand HIV testing, linkages and PREP services. Application due 12/16, ACHCH will be developing strategy and partnerships in upcoming months and present plan to Commission at 12/13 meeting. Gloria reviewed Gileadfunded HIV/HCV testing activities, and staff shared new partnerships for HIV testing and linkages to treatment with Street Health providers.  Medical Respite:  Adeline St: Lifelong has opened doors to Adeline Street medical respite project, which will be monitored by ACHCH. Beds will expand as refurbishing happens. Primary source of referrals will come from AHS.  Alameda Point: Still moving this huge project forward, and HCSA has put ACHCH in a position to help drive the project.  East Oakland: ACHCH involved in discussions between County, EOCP and West Oakland Healht Council to bring respite services to WOHC building adjacent to EOCP.	
Orientation: Homeless Mortality  HCSA Policy Overview and Procedures	David presented slides showing the methodology that ACHCH and CAPE are using to develop a mortality report for Alameda County. Discussion around the need for a countywide Medical Examiner vs. Coroner. Interest from HCH Commissioners to support this work, especially around the research aspects of mortality work. Issue referred to Clinical Committee as a possible project. Plan is to have a first draft of CY2018 and partial CY2019 mortality report complete to share at Homeless Persons Memorial Day events in December.  David shared slides describing the Alameda County Health Care Services Agency's Strategic Initiatives & Public Affairs unit, working to create agencywide coordination of policy, communications and collaborations, and including the HCSA Legislative Council and efforts to advance HCSA vision and mission through proactive strategies.
