



REGISTER TO VOTE!

Register to vote before October 22 and Exercise your Power and Rights!

You can vote by mail or at a polling station.

Can I Register to Vote? Can I Vote? YES, You CAN if you are:

- ✓ **A U.S. citizen**
- ✓ **Living in Alameda County**
- ✓ **18 years of age or older on Election Day (November 6, 2018)**
- ✓ **Not currently in prison or on parole for a felony conviction**
- ✓ **Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law**

People experiencing homelessness can register and vote!

Homeless persons may register to vote as long as they have a place to receive mail and a place where they can be properly assigned to a voting precinct.

If you do not have a home address, you describe the place where you spend most of your time (for example using cross streets, park, shelter, etc). You must provide a mailing address where you can receive elections materials.

You can vote in three ways:

- **By Mail** (get your ballot at your mailing address)
- **In Person** (at a polling place assigned to you based on where you're staying now)
- **Early:** Between Oct 6-Nov 6 at the Registrar of Voters 1225 Oak Street, Oakland (basement)

Persons with a criminal conviction have basic voting rights.

- If you have a misdemeanor conviction, you can ALWAYS vote.
- If you have a felony conviction, you CAN vote if:
 - You are on probation OR
 - You are on post-release community supervision OR
 - You are on mandatory supervision OR
 - You are serving a county jail sentence under Realignment OR
 - You have completed parole.

Put another way: The **only time you CANNOT vote** when you have a felony conviction is if:

- You're IN state or Federal Prison.
- You are **currently on parole**.
